# Letter from the Chatelaine

Salutations! As we go into the summer season of the SCA I ask that you be mindful of those who are not in school and help to give them a hobby that will last them the whole year if they let it! I'm talking about recruitment. With a surge of efforts being directed towards recruitment society wide here are a few things that you can do to help us get more people involved.

1. Be keen about talking about your hobby [the SCA] to any mundane who might seem interested. Maybe it's the lad behind you in the craft store while you're getting fabric for a dress. Or the lady buying lumber when you're there for a new chisel for carving. Get involved in the conversation!
2. Bring a friend to fight practice or the monthly meeting who might want to learn more about what we do and get involved. Meetings are a great place to get a taste without committing to an event.
3. Wear your garb to do mundane things, like grocery shopping, bowling or just going out to dinner with your family. People see the neat things we wear, and most are going to ask questions!
